I work with appropriate faculty, staff, student and community committees and organizations to carry out the mission of the Student Affairs Office and advocate on behalf of students and facilitate communication among campus constituents. Lastly, I'm responsible for the recruitment and selection of talented staff for the Student Affairs Office and the development and administration of policies and practices for Student Affairs staff and student development programs.

- Created the UCO Black Male Initiative & Fellows Program, which consisted of an initial cohort class of 20 students and 5 peer mentors
