BOOK MANUSCRIPT CURRENTLY IN WORKING PROGRESS:

Book: “Voices of War and Peace in the Sudan, 1955-2020: Civilians, Combatants, and Foreign Observers.” This book project is based primarily on interviews with South Sudanese leaders (as well as foreign scholars) on South Sudan who participated directly or indirectly in the First and Second Sudanese Civil Wars. A few of these interviews have been transcribed into print. I applied for the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Fellowship in 2019 but I was not awarded the fellowship. However, I was granted special assignment (SA) by the Dean of the Mansfield campus in the fall of 2020 that enabled me to transcribe more cassette tapes into print. I have currently there are five cassette tapes and three digital interviews that I need to transcribe into print. My department had

requested that I design a new GE course entitled “Introduction to African American and African Studies, 1101 REGD. I had to put a transcription of my cassette tapes on hold in order to work on the syllabus and collect relevant material for this course in the Autumn of 2022. This is one of the two courses that I am currently teaching. I hope to resume the transcription of the cassette tapes in the digital interviews into print before the end of the Spring semester.
